



## **Explanation on Copyright**

### **Copyright protection**

The contents of ZaöRV/HJIL are published under the CC BY-SA 4.0 licence. This allows worldwide, free and unrestricted access to the contents of the journal. The publishing house does not acquire the exclusive right of use under the German law ([§ 38\(1\) UrhG](#)). The one-year blocking period mentioned in the quoted provision thus does not apply.

At the same time, the authors' copyright is preserved in this open content licensing model. The authors retain their copyright. They only grant permission to use, the conditions of which are defined by the CC BY-SA 4.0 licence. In the case of any use by third parties, the original authorship must be indicated, i.e. the name of the author must be mentioned, and there is a particular obligation to include a copyright notice if copies are shared. Within reason, the subsequent user is obliged to provide a Uniform Resource Identifier (URI) or a hyperlink to the original source. This also applies to use in offline publications.

### **Protection against license infringements**

The “automatic termination clause” ensures an effective prosecution of licence violations: Anyone who does not comply with the licensing obligations automatically loses his or her right to use the work, because the licence has expired. Any further use of the work would constitute a copyright infringement which triggers claims for damages, forbearance, or other legal consequences and can be sanctioned.

### **Documentation obligation concerning modifications**

If a subsequent user modifies the content, he/she can only decide on the licence for his/her own modifications. The original work remains under its original licence, and there is an obligation to document changes to the content. This documentation requirement ensures that changes made by third parties are clearly attributed to them and not to the original author. It also ensures that the version history of the work can be traced at any time.
